

Foreword to the new edition

I was most pleased to receive many favourable comments following the publication of the first edition of The Vale of Belvoir Angels. The interest shown in these early slate headstones, which feature charming little carvings of angel heads, was most encouraging. Although the layout of the text is often far from precise, with either letters or words inserted almost as an afterthought, this however tends to give them additional appeal. I always realised that thirty years ago, my late wife and I may not have discovered all the Vale of Belvoir headstones in the churchyards in the villages under investigation. This has proved to be the case, and in addition a number of other places in which these headstones can be seen have also been identified. I have therefore decided to publish a new edition of this book. These new parishes have been visited, and some others re-visited, the inscriptions recorded and included in this new book. Whilst all the slates have carvings of angel faces with the characteristic down-turned wings some of these newer finds, whilst they were executed in the early to mid-eighteenth century differ somewhat in style to the cherub faces seen in the churchyards, which have the more abundant clusters of these slates. Although, they are clearly carved by different hands I have included them in order to complete the survey and indicated in the text where I believe they are variants. To date it has not been established who was responsible for carving these Vale of Belvoir headstones but it has been surmised that they were undertaken by a family of engravers, possibly resident in Hickling or an adjacent village. It is known that John Wright, a talented worker, was domiciled in Hickling and flourished between 1790 and 1830. Were the un-identified carvers of Vale of Belvoir headstones perhaps his forebears?





1. INTRODUCTION

During the mid-1970's my late wife, Pauline Heathcote, and I visited many parish churchyards, principally in Nottinghamshire, in order to make a photographic record of slate headstones. We are particularly fortunate in this area in having an abundant number of early headstones, many of which are essentially as pristine as when they were carved in the 18th and 19th centuries. Unfortunately, some have suffered from neglect by man and regrettably in some parishes headstones have been lifted and laid flat or stacked in heaps or propped against the boundary or church wall. The slate originated from the quarries in Charnwood Forest, in north-west Leicestershire, and had been mined for very many years; one of the principal uses was that of roofing material.



Through our photographs we endeavoured to depict the work of a number of the local engravers who carved these slates, especially the symbolism which they included in addition to the names of the deceased and accompanying verse. These photographs are now held in the collection of the Local Studies Library in Angel Row Nottingham. We held a number of exhibitions of our work in Nottingham libraries in the County and the City and in the Museum of Nottingham Life. Also Pauline often mentioned these headstones in her local history lectures.

However one group of slates were particularly fascinating. These were carved from the late 17th to the mid-18th century and we affectionately styled them "The Vale of Belvoir Angels". The Vale of Belvoir is a somewhat ill-defined area, although Michael Honeybone offers a definition. He concluded that the boundaries lie at the west by the Fosse Way, at the north to include Staunton-in-the-Vale, at the north-east by the Lincolnshire border and at the south by the villages of Nether & Upper Broughton and Ab Kettleby. We visited most of the villages in the Vale but we also went to a number in the bordering counties of Leicestershire and Lincolnshire. These parishes are listed in Section 4 Miscellany, together with the number of slates of the Vale of Belvoir type recorded. Also the persons commemorated are listed in alphabetical order. The main characteristic of the group is that they all have one or sometimes two cherubs' heads with



down-turned wings and an attendant ruff. These heads were usually carved at the top of the slate, but occasionally in the middle

or at the bottom. The design of these headstones barely changes over the 60-year period in which they were produced. There is no symmetrical layout to the lettering but a straight-forward carving from the left-hand edge to the right with a final letter or word sometimes squeezed in above or below the line. The foregoing shows that the words had not been laid out prior to engraving. The earliest carving found in the Vale was at Redmile which bears the date 1690 although an earlier one, 1681, was discovered at

Melton Mowbray. The latest was dated 1759 at Old Dalby. The slates recorded are listed alphabetically by parish in Section 2, each being numerically identified, giving a grand total of 328 recordings. Some of these gravestones were photographed and these are reproduced in Section 3. The vast majority are located in those churchyards within the Vale, with the greatest concentration being at seen at Granby (22 slates), Upper Broughton (25 slates), Hickling (33 slates) and Nether Broughton (34 slates). Maurice Barley² came to the conclusion that the individuals who carved these unsigned slates most likely were domiciled in one of these villages. Although the general style and the crudeness of their work are consistent throughout the period, by close inspection it is possible to detect carvings by different hands and Maurice Barley² gives us a number of examples.

A churchyard with its gravestones presents us with an oasis of calm and tranquillity. In those instances where the monuments have been removed the area surrounding the church appears sterile and sanitized; all its former character having been swept away. Much may be gleaned from a study of gravestones and as previously mentioned, we in the southern area of Nottinghamshire and the borders with Leicestershire and Lincolnshire are very fortunate in having many slate headstones; every effort should be made to preserve them. Many of these slates were carved by individuals residing in the villages and therefore of interest to modern-day local historians. Apart from the afore mentioned slates, they are sometimes signed by the maker's name or initials. Ecclesiastical symbolism is carved into many slates and well-worth a close look; death being represented by a skeleton or a hand-held skull, eternity by a circle depicted by a snake biting its own tail. Other symbols include the tree-of-life, grief by the weeping willow, hope by an anchor, purity by a lily, affection by a pair of birds, and receiving the soul into heaven by the hand of God reaching out from the clouds. Time is represented by a figure clad in a loin-cloth, holding a hour-glass or a scythe, mortality by an engraving of the earth, and the grave by the sextants' tools, crossed pike & shovel. The early angel heads seen on the Vale of Belvoir stones possibly represents the soul of the departed winging its way to heaven.

Finally let us reflect on Sir John Betjeman's poem entitled 'Churchyards'. This is a selection:

For churchyards then, though hallowed ground Were not so grim as now they sound, And horns of ale were handed round For which churchwardens used to pay On each especial vestry day, 'Twas thus the village drunk its beer With its relations buried near, And that is why we often see Inns where the alehouse used to be Close to the church when prayers were said And Masses for the village dead... But this I know, you're sure to find Some headstones of the Georgian kind In each old churchyard near and far, Just go and see how fine they are. Notice the lettering of that age

Spaced like a noble title-page,
The parish names cut deep and strong
To hold the shades of evening long,
The quaint and sometimes touching rhymes
By parish poets of the times,
Bellows, or reaping hook or spade
To show, perhaps, the dead man's trade,
And cherubs in the corner spaces
With wings and English ploughboy faces.
I hate to see in old churchyards
Tombstones stacked round like playing cards
Along the wall which then encloses
A trim new lawn and standard roses
Bird-baths and objects such as fill a
Garden in some suburban villa

Photographing the slate headstones

The photographs were taken on sunny days in late spring or early autumn in the 1970's. We chose to make the exposures around about mid-day for at this time the sun's light would cross the east-face of the headstones so best highlighting the carvings. The camera used was a medium-format Mamiyaflex with a 55 mm lens and Ilford Pan F film rated at 32 ASA. Prior to taking the photographs it was essential to clean the headstones by removing lichens, moss and bird-droppings, and to cut away the surrounding grass. We came to the churchyard prepared with a bucket of water, sponges, small brushes and towels to dry the cleaned slates, and clippers to shorten the grass. As you may well surmise, this activity frequently caused some interest to those parishioners who were walking through or passing-by the churchyard! However, we always had prior permission from the vicar.

[Perhaps today's digital techniques would make the photography somewhat easier but the preparatory work is still essential.]

Conclusions

It is hoped that this little book will encourage others to visit some of our churchyards in the Vale of Belvoir and elsewhere and enjoy examining the slate headstones which in many instances are in pristine condition considering that some were carved over three hundred years ago. Although 328 slates have been recorded I am confident that over time more early angel faces will be found in parishes not covered in this new edition.
