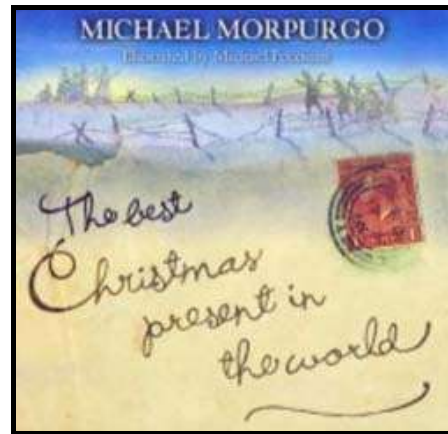

& it's very, very Christmassy!!!

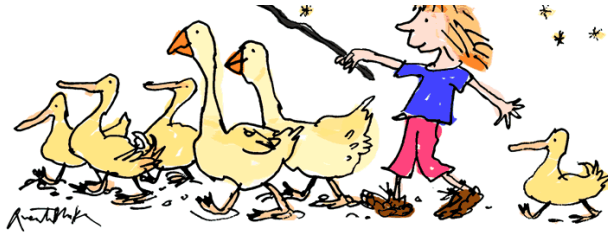

# farms for city children

Children's writer Michael Morpurgo and his wife Clare founded farms for city children in 1976 at **Nethercott Farm**, deep in Devon river country. We now operate three working farms: **Treginnis Isaf** on the Pembrokeshire coast opened twenty years ago and **Wick Court** in Gloucestershire opened in 1997. We aim to expand the horizons of children from towns and cities all over the country by offering them a week in the countryside living together on one of our farms.



Working together in teams, the children get involved in everything necessary to keep the farm going. It is an unforgettable experience, stretching them physically, intellectually and emotionally. For some, it is the first time they have seen a sky full of stars or a horizon that is not man made. For all of them, the project addresses such basic issues as where our food comes from, the importance of conservation, sustainability and good citizenship.



## How it happens

Over 3,000 children and their teachers visit our farms each year. They come in groups of 36-40 and stay for seven days. Their work on the farm ranges from milking and mucking out, lambing and calving, feeding and grooming, to apple pressing and cheese making.

## Learning

The experience relates directly to many areas of the National Curriculum and to vital environmental and conservation issues. We have links with writers and artists, going right back to our Founding President, the late Ted Hughes, and founding Director, Michael Morpurgo. We believe that creating and making are an essential part of learning and we provide an opportunity for the children to work with writers, artists and makers during their stay, reflecting on their many new experiences on the farms.

The farm and the rural landscape are integral to his message and Michael Morpurgo and his wife have made a reality of this angle through their charity 'Farms for City Children' which introduces thousands of children a year to the reality (and pleasure) of the rural life we all take for granted in Hickling.
