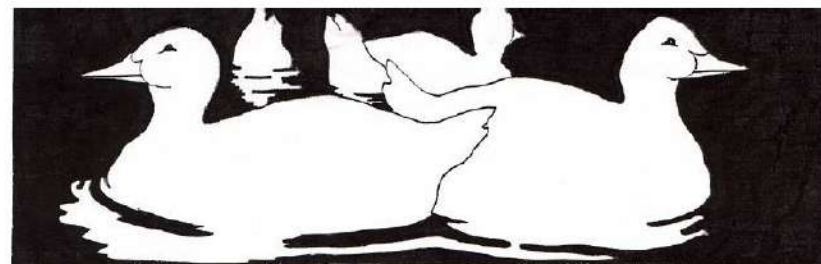

Coronavirus

At a time when we all need to be looking out for neighbours, here is some helpful advice from Neighbourhood Watch:

10 ways you can protect yourself, your loved ones and your community:

1. Meet with household members, other relatives, friends and neighbours to discuss what to do if a COVID-19 outbreak occurs in your community and what the needs of each person will be.
2. If your neighbourhood has a website or social media page, consider joining it to maintain access to neighbours, information, and resources. Alternatively, share phone numbers and email addresses particularly with those who are isolated or vulnerable.
3. Consider establishing a 'buddy' system within your community to ensure everyone stays connected to COVID-19 related news, services and can receive support safely, such as essentials deliveries.
4. Plan ways to care for those who might be at greater risk for serious complications.
5. Choose a room in your home that can be used to separate sick household members from those who are healthy.
6. Learn how to self-isolate. Guidance can be found on the NHS website: <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolation-advice/>
7. Create a list of local organisations that you and your neighbours can contact in the event that one of you need access to information, healthcare services, support, or resources. Consider including organisations that provide mental health or counselling services, food, and other supplies.
8. Create an emergency contact list of family, friends, neighbours, healthcare providers, teachers, employers, the local public health department, and other community resources.
9. Learn about the emergency operations plan at your child's school or childcare facility, and your employer's emergency operations plan.
10. Practice everyday preventive actions including regular hand washing.

We will keep you informed.

75th Anniversary of WW2 VE Day, Victory in Europe

The 75th anniversary of VE Day falls on 8th May when Nazi Germany unconditionally surrendered its armed forces in 1945. Huge celebrations and street parties took place all over Britain. Large crowds gathered in central London and outside Buckingham Palace. Cities in Britain had been subjected to 5 years of bombing by the Luftwaffe. 2 million British homes were destroyed. 2¼ million people were made homeless. 45,000 people had been killed including 8,000 children. Food supplies were scarce, and rationing added to the austerity. I am old enough to remember the chilling sound of the air raid sirens and the distinctive sound of the unsynchronised engines of German bombers as they passed overhead to attack the industrial cities of the midlands.

The tide of the war in Europe was turned by the D-Day landings in on 6 June 1944. British, American and Empire forces mounted the largest sea and airborne invasion of Normandy beaches and hinterland the world has ever seen. By April 1945 the Nazis realised they were defeated. Hitler committed suicide in his bunker during the Battle of Berlin on April 30 leaving his successor Karl Donitz to authorise the military surrender. General Alfred Jodl representing German High Command unconditionally surrendered to the Allies in Reims, France on 7 May, and again in Berlin on 8 May 1945. Europe was finally liberated from the Nazis and the Death Camps after nearly 6 years of brutal warfare.

But the war in the Far East continued. Britain was an imperial power with colonies across south and south-east Asia. In December 1941, Japan attacked British territories in Hong Kong, Malaya (now Malaysia), Singapore and Burma

(now Myanmar). By mid 1945 the Japanese had been defeated by the US and British Allied forces but refused to surrender. Since it was estimated that up to 1 million soldiers would die in a land invasion, President Truman authorised the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The Japanese finally officially surrendered on 2 September 1945, known as VJ Day thereafter.

VE Day Celebrations

May Day normally falls on a Monday but this year the Government has decided that it will be put back to Friday 8 May 2020 to coincide with the 75th Anniversary of VE Day. This holiday will form part of a three-day weekend of commemorative events. On Friday 8 May thousands of pipers will play Battle's O'er at various locations throughout the land and 20,000 pubs will take part in the Nation's Toast to the Heroes of WW2 at 3pm, church bells will ring out for peace at 7pm. On Saturday 9 May Local Councils will encourage communities to arrange parties in Village Halls, perhaps food and dress reflecting the 1940s. And on Sunday 10 May Services of celebration and commemoration will take place in cathedrals and churches. Any of these events may be hit by measures to contain Coronavirus.

St Luke's events leading up to Easter Sunday.

Lent began a couple of weeks ago, that time in the Christian year when we think about Jesus being tempted in the desert by Satan and begin to prepare for what is a momentous event in the Christian calendar: EASTER DAY.

Palm Sunday 5th April at Hickling Church

Is the time we remember Jesus riding into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey and crowds of people welcoming him with shouts of Hosanna and the waving of palm branches. To celebrate this story the three St Luke's Churches will be joining together for a walk to church. We shall start from Hickling Village Hall at 9.45am and walk to St Luke's Church giving out Palm Crosses to all we see. At church we shall collectively read the Passion of St Luke to be followed by a service of Holy Communion. We extend a very warm welcome to you all to join us at church.

Holy Week is the week before Easter Sunday.

The Thursday of Holy Week is Maundy Thursday (9th April) where our Queen gives out the Maundy Money and commemorates the time that Jesus washed the feet of his disciples. There will be a service at Kinoulton Church where following Holy Communion the altar will be stripped in preparation for Good Friday.

Good Friday 10th April

Good Friday is the day that, despite the Roman Governor Pontius Pilate being able to find no fault in Him, Jesus was crucified upon the Cross on Golgotha. To remind us of this journey and sacrifice Jesus undertook for us all, there will be a Walk of Faith from St Luke's Church at Upper Broughton to St Luke's at Hickling and then along the footpath to St Luke's Kinoulton. There will be readings and Passions Hymns sung at each church and to ensure we don't "pass out" along the way refreshments will be served at each church. The walk starts at 12.00noon at Upper Broughton Church and will conclude at Kinoulton Church with a time of silent reflection. We extend a very warm invitation to everyone to come along and join with us for some or all of the walk.

Easter Day: Sunday 12th April

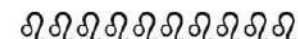

Keith Wadkin recently gave cheques for £656 to Professor Kevin Morgan of Nottingham University to support his research into Alzheimer's Disease. Keith has now raised nearly £9,000 for this cause.

Professor Morgan told supporters that an application for the approval of a new drug is being considered by the US authorities. If successful it would be the first such case in over 20 years and he thought that this would encourage other companies to resume research. The drug does not cure the disease but slows down its progress. Screening can now be done much more rapidly and cheaply and could mean the new drug being given to those at risk 20 to 40 years before the symptoms emerge. In most cases Alzheimer's is not detected in people until their mid seventies but the process of neurodegeneration would have started in their 30s or 40s.

Close to one million people in the UK are suffering from Alzheimer's, with those indirectly affected numbering about 15 million. Professor Morgan felt that "at long last it looks as though we might be getting somewhere".

19/02868/FUL: Conversion and extension of existing barns and outbuildings to form two new dwellings - Sycamore Lodge, Green Lane, Hickling Pastures. NO OBJECTION

Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group Update.

The Council had been made aware of the claim for the instatement of the footpath on Clawson Lane, prior to the meeting. As part of the information provided, the Clerk had forwarded two maps which were layered on top of each other that demonstrated the change to the road outside the cemetery. 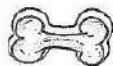
